Following, we will go to the Berlin Wall to explore where the infamous wall once stood. Next we will take a look at the Old Town Gate and finally visit the Dutch Quarter.

Berlin Victory Column (Outside visit)

Welcome to one of Berlin's most famous and popular tourist spot known as The Victory Column! It is another of Berlin's monuments that has reinvented itself through the ages. Once a symbol of Prussian military victory in the 19th century to a favorite tourist hotspot today. The 67m high symbol of victory originally stood in front of the Reichstag in the former Königsplatz and today's Platz der Republik. The 8.3m tall statue on the top of the column represents both Victoria, the Goddess of Victory and Borussia the allegory and Latin name of Prussia.

Brandenburg Gate (Outside visit)

Join us as we visit the Brandenburg Gate! It is one of the most iconic sights in Berlin. The Brandenburg Gate is more than just Berlin's only surviving historical city gate; this site came to symbolize Berlin's Cold War division into East and West. Architecturally, the sandstone Brandenburg Gate also represents one of the earliest and most attractive examples of a neo-classical building in Germany.

Reichstag building (Outside visit)

The Reichstag was constructed to house the Imperial Diet (German: Reichstag) of the German Empire. It was opened in 1894 and housed the Diet until 1933, when it was severely damaged after being set on fire. After its completion in 1999, it once again became the meeting place of the German parliament: the modern Bundestag.

Berlin Cathedral (Outside visit)

The magnificent dome of the Cathedral Church (Berliner Dom) is one of the main landmarks in Berlin's cityscape. The Berlin Cathedral marks the spot of the impressive basilica housing the city's most important Protestant church. With the cathedral's intricate designs, it is a must-see destination that you will easily fall in love with.

Berlin Wall (Outside visit)

From August 13th, 1961, to November 9th of 1989, Berlin was divided into East and West. The Berlin Wall remains to this day a unique and emblematic symbol of that period. The East Side Gallery is the longest surviving section of the Berlin Wall. The most famous is the work known as the "Fraternal Kiss", depicting a kiss between Russian leader Leonid Brezhnev and East Germany's SED Party Chairman Erich Honecker.

Potsdam Old Town Gate

Potsdam has three magnificent city gates that represent the symbols of Potsdam's Old City: Brandenburg Gate. Brandenburg Gate is a triumphal arch commemorating the victory in the Seven Years' War. A popular meeting place in the inner city of Potsdam, presenting a typical British neo-Gothic style.

Dutch Quarter

The Dutch Quarter (Holländisches Viertel) is a neighborhood in Potsdam, consisting of 134 red Dutch brick buildings. Almost all of the Dutch brick buildings have been renovated. The Dutch Quarter is a unique site to discover.

It is known as one of the most beautiful cities in Europe and the first city in the world to be designated as a world cultural heritage.

Prague Castle

A beauty of its own to discover is the Prague Castle! It is one of the largest coherent castle complexes in the world. It consists of a large-scale composition of palaces and ecclesiastical buildings of various architectural styles from the remains of Romanesque-style buildings in the 10th century through the Gothic modifications of the 14th century.

St. Vitus Cathedral

St. Vitus Cathedral is another highlighted destination to discover! It is located in Prague and is the largest and the most important temple! Apart from religious services, coronations of Czech kings and queens also took place here. The cathedral is a place of burial of several patron saints, sovereigns, noblemen and archbishops.

Golden Lane

Let's take you to visit colorful and vibrant townhouses! Golden Lane originated after the construction of a new northern wall of the castle. The area of the northern bailey was used for the building of modest dwellings, which are now the last remainder of the small-scale architecture of Prague Castle. Let's take a look at this architectural destination.

Starý královský palác

This palace was the seat of Bohemian princes and kings until the 16th century. It was built on the remains of the Romanesque Soběslav Palace. Most notable is the Gothic Vladislav Hall – the largest secular space of medieval Prague (1487 – 1500, Benedikt Rejt) with remarkable rib vaulting, used today as the venue for ceremonial state events.

St. George's Basilica

St. George's Basilica (Czech: Bazilika sv. Jiří) is the oldest surviving church building within Prague Castle, Prague, Czech Republic. The basilica was founded by Vratislaus I of Bohemia in 920. It is dedicated to Saint George. Primarily Romanesque in style, it is part of the collection of buildings that comprise the castle, the political capital of the nation, and the spiritual center of the Czech state.

Charles Bridge

Charles Bridge is a 14th century stone bridge linking the two sides of Prague. This magnificent structure is one of the city's finest attractions, is the main pedestrian route connecting the Old Town with the Lesser Town and Prague Castle. It is a uniquely designed bridge filled with musicians, painters, vendors and tourists.

Old Town Hall (Prague)

Old Town Hall is the capital of the Czech Republic and one of the most highlighted places to explore. It was established in 1338 as the seat of the Old Town administration. The oldest part of the complex consists of the southern wing. It contains a beautiful Gothic tower with a bay chapel and a unique astronomical clock known as the Orloj. Every hour between 9 am and 11 pm the Orloj has the twelve apostles appear.

The Astronomical Clock

The Astronomical Clock is the great landmark of Old Town Square. Situated on the southern wall of Prague Town Hall, it is such a compelling sight that it has possibly become the most photographed landmark by tourists visiting the beautiful capital city of the Czech Republic. The clock is unusual in that, in addition to indicating the 24 hours of the day, the astronomical dial shows the position of the sun and the moon in the sky, along with other astronomical information.

The Church of our Lady before Tyn

The Church of our Lady before Tyn is one of the most impressive Gothic religious buildings in Prague. It was built from the mid-14th to the early 16th centuries. At the end of the 17th century, the interior was reworked in Baroque style. The cathedral serves as an extensive gallery of Gothic, Renaissance and Early Baroque works, the most interesting of which include altar paintings by Karel Škréta and the tomb of the astronomer Tycho Brahe. This Prague sightseeing is an outstanding building of the Czech capital, with mounting towers over the Old Town (Staré město) and square buildings'

bright roofs.

Old Town Square, Prague

Where does the true heart of Prague beat? On the Old Town Square of course! It is precisely here that winding lanes of the Old Town run, in order to spill out onto the most beautiful square in Prague. The elegant tower of the Town Hall with the world famous astronomical clock, the proud silhouette of the fairytale Týn Cathedral, the monumental Church of St. Nicholas and countless multicoloured houses of many styles lend this place a unique atmosphere, which will captivate all those who decide to take a look at its charm.

Prašná brána

The Powder Tower or Powder Gate (Czech: Prašná brána) is a Gothic tower in Prague, Czech Republic. It is one of the original city gates. It separates the Old Town from the New Town.

Do you love Opera? Take a look as we drive by The Vienna State Opera. It is an opera house and opera company based in Vienna, Austria. The 1,709-seat Renaissance Revival venue was the first major building on the Vienna Ring Road.

Musikverein

The golden Strauss memorial

The musician Johann Strauss, who is known around the world as the "King of Waltz" is a significant figure for the Austrians. This statue is located in the city park and has become a symbol of Vienna. The statue is located in a white curved arch with an exquisite angel relief carved on it. On the inside of the arch, the golden Strauss is "playing" the violin. The statues are always crowded with tourists who come to pay their respects.

Hofburg

The Hofburg is the official residence and workplace of the President of Austria and was formerly the principal imperial palace of the Habsburg dynasty. Located in the center of Vienna, it was built in the 13th century and expanded several times afterwards.

St. Stephen's Cathedral

St. Stephen's Cathedral is the mother church of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Vienna and the seat of the Archbishop of Vienna, Christoph Cardinal Schönborn, OP. The current Romanesque and Gothic form of the cathedral today in the Stephansplatz. It was largely introduced by Duke Rudolf IV (1339–1365) and stands on the ruins of two earlier churches that were previously there. The most important religious church that you must visit in Vienna is St. Stephen's Cathedral.

Pestsäule

This Pestsäule drew its inspiration from the tradition of Marian or Holy Trinity columns. These are columns topped by the Virgin Mary or a representation of the Holy Trinity, erected typically as a declaration of faith or out of gratitude for surviving some dramatic event, like a war.

Austrian Parliament Building

The Austrian Parliament Building in Vienna is where the two houses of the Austrian Parliament conduct their sessions. The building is located on the Ringstraße boulevard in the first district Innere Stadt, near Hofburg Palace and the Palace of Justice. The Parliament Building is the site of important state ceremonies, most notably the swearing-in ceremony of the President of Austria and the state speech on National Day each October 26.

Ringstrasse Boulevard

The Ringstrasse is a circular boulevard that surrounds Vienna's historical centre. The boulevard is the most important street in the city, built where the walls of the old Medieval city were located. It is home to some of Vienna's most iconic buildings. The magnificent buildings that line this boulevard include the Hofburg Palace, the Rathaus, the Stock Exchange, the Parliament, the Burgtheater, the Votivkirche, the University, the Art History Museum and the Natural History Museum.

Carinthian Street

Carinthian Street is the most famous street in central Vienna. It runs from the Stephansplatz out to the Wiener Staatsoper at Karlsplatz on the Ringstraße.

Café Central

Café Central is operated by Palais Events and located inside Palais Ferstel, a palatial mansion house inspired by Venetian Trecento-era architecture. Suitable for various kinds of events, its rooms are bound to leave an unforgettable impression on guests.

Schönbrunn Palace

Schönbrunn Palace is one of Europe's most beautiful Baroque complexes and has been in the possession of the Habsburgs since 1569. The wife of Emperor Ferdinand II, Eleonore von Gonzaga, had a pleasure palace built on the site in 1642 and called the property "Schönbrunn" for the first time. The palace and garden complex created from 1696 onwards following the siege of Vienna was complete redesigned under Maria Theresa after 1743. Today, due to its historical significance, its unique layout and magnificent furnishings, the palace is a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Slovak National Theatre

Let's take a look at a historical theater that was built in 1886 known as the Slovak National Theatre. Ballet, opera, and drama are the theatrical ensembles located here. It is the main theater in Bratislava, where plays and operas are often staged.

The Michaelitor

The Michaelitor was one of the most important gates and entrance points to the city of Salzburg. Today, the site of the gate is the link between the Mozartplatz Square and the Mozartsteg Bridge. There is only one section of the Michaelitor that was preserved: The so-called Zeugwartstöckl, the residential tower for the gate keepers, which was built in 1628. It is a noteworthy building with a nice sgraffito sun dial on the wall. It is the oldest part of the fortifications.

Presidential Palace Square

The Presidential Palace was built in the 18th century! Today we will drive by and take a visit at the world fountain and Presidential Palace Square.

Maximilian's fountain

Today we will take you to visit the Maximilian fountain! The fountain was built in 1572 in the Austrian stone workshop of Andreas Lutringer, II. Legend has it that a knight stands toward the face of the townhall and then turns and bows his head in honor of the people that saved the city. It is also stated that he turns in all four directions to show his protection to the city.

Suspension bridge

On the beautiful Danube River in Bratislava lies a double-layered highway bridge that spans both banks and connects the old and new urban areas together. This is the famous local new bridge spot where tourists visit. Compared with various historical monuments, the new bridge is very young and modern, forming a unique landscape of the old city. There is also the "flying saucer" bridge that spans the north and south of the Danube.

Heroes' Square

Welcome to Budapest's Heroes' Square! It houses one of the city's iconic symbols, the Millennium Memorial, which includes the seven chieftains of the Magyar tribes that founded Hungary and other important heads of state. In between the statues is a large column crowned by Archangel Gabriel.

Matthias Church

It is a historic building with an important history. Two Kings of Hungary were crowned within its walls: Franz Joseph I of Hungary and Elisabeth, and Charles IV of Hungary and Zita of Bourbon-Parma.

Fisherman's Bastion

Fisherman's Bastion in Budapest is easily one of the top Budapest attractions. The present-day lovely lookout towers and decorative fortification of the Fisherman's Bastion was built in the 19th century. It serves as a lookout tower for the best panoramic views in Budapest, Hungary.
